

## **Financial support for 6<sup>th</sup> Form Students in 2022/23**

The following information applies to students aged 16 to 19 on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2022 taking a full-time further education course in 2022/23.

### **Defined vulnerable group Bursary**

Students falling within the following categories will be entitled to a bursary of up to £1,200:

- > You are in care, including unaccompanied asylum-seeking children
- > You are care leaver
- > You are receiving Income Support, or the equivalent Universal Credit in your own right
- > You are disabled and receiving both Disability Living Allowance (or the new Personal Independence Payments) and Employment Support Allowance (or Universal Credit as a replacement for ESA).

### **Discretionary Bursary**

Using the policy below, students may be eligible for a discretionary bursary of up to £1,200, if your household income is less than £25,000 a year

You could potentially get assistance towards the costs of: Transport, books, trips, meals, etc. Proof of household income (or income-based benefits) will be required.

## **Bursary Fund Policy 2022/23**

### **What is the Bursary Fund?**

The fund is made available from the government through its funding body - Education & Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) for 16-19 year olds - to provide assistance to students whose access to, or completion of, education is inhibited by financial constraints or barriers.

### **Who is eligible to apply for Bursary Funding?**

**Students following government (ESFA) funded full time or part-time courses, who are 16 years and over and satisfy one or more of the following criteria:-**

- Students aged at least 16 and under 19 years of age on 31/08/22 who are in care, are leaving care, are in direct receipt of Income Support or are disabled and in receipt of both Employment Support Allowance and Disability Living Allowance
- Students who are economically or socially disadvantaged and at risk of not taking up or continuing in their education. This group includes students with physical or other disabilities, medical conditions and/or learning difficulties.
- Students who have been in care, on probation, are young parents or are otherwise considered at risk.
- Asylum seekers
- Refugees (who will have access to 16-19 Bursary Funding if they are in receipt of supportive evidence from DWP).
- Lone parents

## **Who is not eligible for 16-19 Bursary Funding?**

- Students under 16 years of age or over 19 years of age on 31/08/22.
- Students who do not meet the residency qualifications.

## **How does the Academy assess applications and allocate 16-19 Bursary funding?**

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is a limited fund and the Academy will prioritise allocations in 3 groups as follows:

### **High priority group**

Eligible students who fall into one of the following categories:

- Are currently in care (as defined by social services)
- Are leaving or have recently left care
- Are in receipt of Income Support, or the equivalent Universal Credit in your own right.
- Are disabled and receiving both Disability Living Allowance (or the new Personal Independence Payments) and Employment Support Allowance (or Universal Credit as a replacement for ESA).

Eligible students will be entitled to support of up to £1,200, depending upon actual financial needs.

### **Medium priority group**

Eligible students who fall into the following category:

- Have a gross annual household income of below £20,000.

Eligible students may be entitled to support of up to £800, depending upon actual financial needs, towards the cost of transport, essential course equipment, trips, uniforms, course materials.

### **Low priority group**

Eligible students who fall into the following category:

- Have a gross annual household income of between £20,000 and £25,000.

Eligible students may be entitled to support of up to £400, depending upon actual financial needs, towards the cost of transport, essential course equipment, trips, uniforms, course materials.

This category will also be dependent on the balance of the funds available after the High and Medium priority groups have been allocated. In some cases, awards may not be made until after 31 December 2022.

**Please speak to your 6th Form Support Officer and subject teachers to discuss your needs and any planned trips across the year before handing in your application.**

## **Payments**

Payments will be made against receipts. Which must be provided for all expenditure, except school trips.

## **Conditions**

To continue to receive bursary support the student must satisfy the following conditions:

- The student's level of unauthorised and unexplained absence from all lessons must be no greater than 10%
- The student must not have broken the terms of the Sixth Form Contract.

The academy will assess household income as evidenced by receipt of benefit and/or P60, Tax Credit Award Notice or evidence of self-employment income. The receipt of Free School Meals does not automatically entitle a student to Bursary Funds but we will take such criterion into account.

## **Allocations**

A Bursary Fund Committee made up of the Headteacher, Deputy Head and Business Manager will assess applications in September, January and April, taking advice from the Head of 6<sup>th</sup> Form. Students will be informed of the committee decisions as soon as possible. Any appeals against decisions can be made to the Chair of Governors, via the academy complaint's procedure.
