The role will involve assisting in the day to day running of the boat club as well as taking the lead, motivating and coaching either the boys or girls' senior squads towards this vision.

With record numbers in the boat club this season and the largest senior group for many years this is a great time to join Borlase. Our excellent training facilities and equipment provide a great platform for our rowers to learn and enjoy rowing.

Candidates must have some flexibility and be available to coach at weekends, during school holidays and attend a training camp normally over the Easter break.

Qualifications in coaching are helpful, a passion for the sport is essential. Trailer driving and minibus licenses are also desirable.

For the successful applicant, there is the opportunity to take on an additional role as Cover Assistant. This is to help with learning support and other school related duties for 14.5 hours per week, Term Time Only, pay range 1B, actual salary range £5,624 - £6,172 depending on experience.

An exciting opportunity has arisen for a junior rowing coordinator to join our outstanding PE and Sport team. The Junior Rowing coordinator will report to the Director of Rowing and will help the school with its vision for rowing as a high-performance sculling centre. This is a part-time year-round position.

Sport plays an important part of the school ethos where we have a long-standing tradition of excellence in many activities. Rowing and Hockey are our two “premier” sports. Rowing training is provided from Year 9 upwards, both as a curricular and extra-curricular activity, including as part of the GCSE and A level PE elective syllabus. SWBGS currently have 130 competitive rowing members. The squads train on The River Thames in Marlow approximately a 15-minute walk from school. The school is known for its competitiveness in rowing at national and international level with medals at National Schools’ Regatta, Henley Royal Regatta and The Junior World Championships. There is strong participation in rowing coaching from members of staff, and excellent support from a very active Parents Support Group, all of which will continue in the future. We are also proud of our excellent fleet of boats, blades and gym equipment.

- To assist with rowing administration including managing subscriptions and arranging regattas and head races

- To assist with trips and training camps which promote rowing in accordance with school trip policies and Guidance
