Guidance on Remote Education (September 2022)

The temporary provisions in the Coronavirus Act 2020 expired on 24 March 2022. As a result the <u>Remote Education (England) Temporary Continuity (No.2) direction</u> no longer has effect.

Parents are reminded that Attendance is mandatory for all pupils of compulsory school age. Good Attendance, as of our policy is 95% and above. Face to face learning supports all students in fulfilling their potential for academic and personal development and progress.

The school would consider providing remote education to pupils in circumstances when in-person attendance is either not possible or contrary to government guidance.

This might include:

- occasions when school leaders decide that it is not possible for their setting to open safely, or that opening would contradict guidance from local or central government
- rare occasions when individual pupils, for a limited duration, are unable to
 physically attend their school but are able to continue learning, for example where
 they have had an injury/ operation making it not possible to travel or have a
 notifiable infectious disease (where the student is well but there is a quarantine
 period).

Students would be set work via the google classroom and resources would be shared with them via this route or school email. This would have been agreed through consultation with the student's Key Stage Office and also the SENDco where applicable.
