The Week at Borlase



I hope you will forgive a relatively short email this week. It's not that we haven't been busy in school - quite the opposite - but there has been little time for taking photos and there is little energy left for writing letters.

You will know that the school was visited by Ofsted on Wednesday and Thursday this week. We received notification before break time on Tuesday and Mrs Walder and Mrs Woodgate asked me to step out from my Year 7 History class to say that somebody from Ofsted had called, wouldn't leave a message, but would call back in 15 minutes' time. This triggered a series of notifications to staff, students and you, the parents and carers with various briefings taking place around a 90 minute conversation with the Lead Inspector and the Senior Leadership Team. I am pleased to say that the inspection went well and the team got a good flavour of what Borlase is like (which is hard to do in only two days), visiting lessons and different activities, meeting with staff, students and governors, walking around at break and lunch, and examining policies and other documents. They were very complimentary about the students, their attitude to learning and said "[they] show exceptional character all of the time. They will be well-rounded and able to cope with all that life throws at them." The final grading will not be confirmed until the report is written, reviewed and published in 30 days' time. My thanks go to all the students, staff and to you for your support over the week.

Friday gave a bit of a chance to breathe. Rahil and Connor ensured normal service was resumed bringing a car onto site to garner students' opinions. This time it wasn't a sports car but a Citroen Ami, an electric car limited to 28mph which fits a little better with our sustainability goals. A walkabout during Period 5 found Year 8s finishing their week in the Dance Studio, working hard on armography after getting their HPV vaccinations earlier in the day while tonight is the eagerly anticipated Arts Dinner.
