



## Transition - Hockey Camp and Multi Activity Camp 2024

We traditionally run a multi-activity transition summer camp and a hockey camp in the summer holidays before the start of the Autumn term.

Pupils can sign up to one or both of these camps.

The Hockey Camp will run on Monday 29 July and Tuesday 30 July. Students attend both of these days from 9am to 3:30pm.

The multi-activity camp will run from Tuesday 27 August to Thursday 29 August. Students attend all of these days from 9am to 3:30pm.

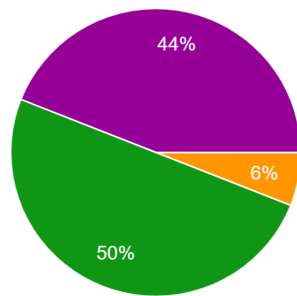
#### FAQs

- 1. Can I attend just one of the camps or do I have to do both?**
  - a. You can do one or both camps.
- 2. Do I need to have played hockey before to attend the camp ?**
  - a. Absolutely not - the purpose of the camp is for our new students to mix and ability is not a barrier to participation.
- 3. Will I be with my friends?**
  - a. The purpose of the camp is to meet with people from across the year group to help build new positive relationships. You may be with people you know, or you may not.
- 4. Are the camps compulsory/overnight**
  - a. No - these are optional and they are not overnight.
- 5. What will I need to bring?**
  - a. Letters will be sent out prior to the camp outlining the items you will need.
- 6. What will we be doing at the multi activity camp?**
  - a. A variety of activities in mixed groups including dance, drama, music, sports, history and art.
- 7. Are the Camps free?**
  - a. No, there is a charge explained on the next few pages. It is our wish that all children can participate in the camps so there are funds available to help you and information is contained in the link on page 3.

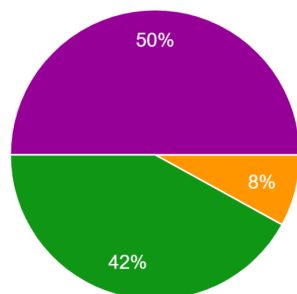

The camp helped me to foster some new positive relationships with other pupils?

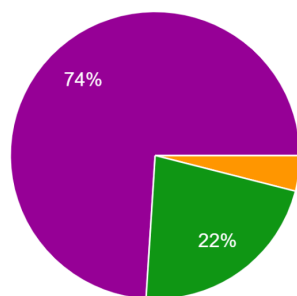
