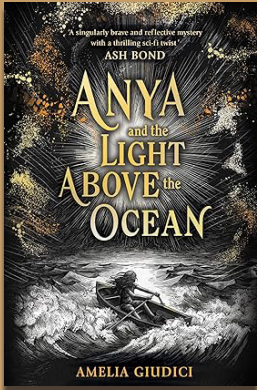


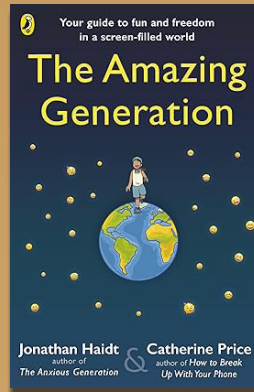

Fiction

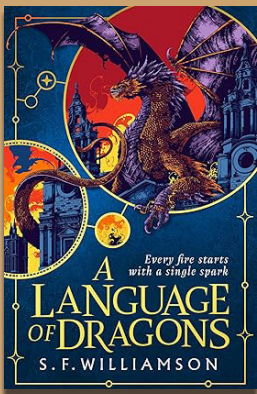

Fiction

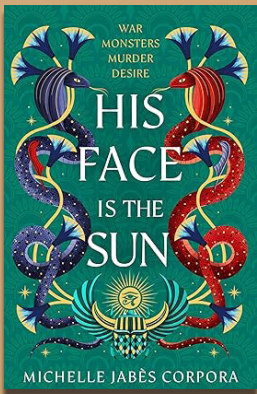

Fiction

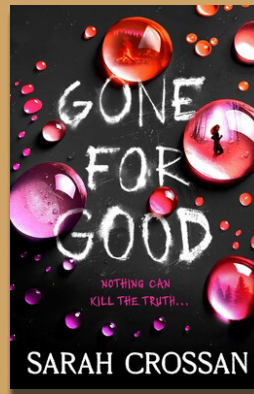

Fiction

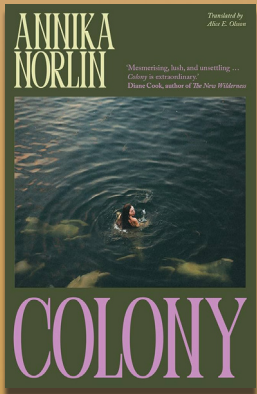

Fiction

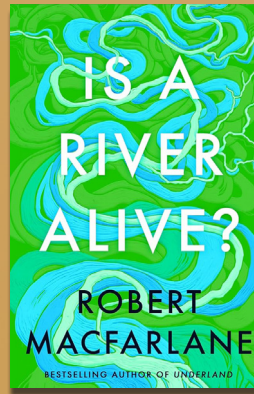
